Pastor's Letter

This weekend we celebrate the feast of the Epiphany which is the second manifestation of Christ to the world during this Christmas season (Christmas being the first and the baptism in the Jordan being the third). Over 2000 years later, we are called to continue to manifest Jesus to the world by what we say and do. We do this individually in our work and home lives. However, we also do it corporately as a Church. Most often this is achieved in the parish. An oft-repeated phrase is that most politics is local. Such is also the case in terms of the Church.

What are the characteristics of this local expression? First, we manifest Christ to the world through our life of prayer centered in the Eucharist or Mass. When we make community prayer a priority in our lives, it says to the world around us that prayer is meaningful. When we kneel/stand or sit on Sundays instead of being horizontal in bed—it says to people that we draw our inner strength from God's word and Jesus' presence in the Eucharist. Second, we manifest Christ to the world through our standing up for what is right, of being prophetic in a society that still needs to hear voices like that of John the Baptist, voices crying out in the wilderness of secularism and moral relativism that there is in fact, objective truth. This is why our parish places a premium on theological education. We cannot preach the truth unless we have first received the truth. Third, we manifest Christ to the world in our life of service. Our willingness as a parish to act on behalf of justice and peace serves to reinforce Christ's own words—when we do this for the least of our brothers and sisters, we do it for Jesus. Our outreach is not merely humanitarian but is motivated by the profound realization of recognizing the image and likeness of God in the other. Fourth, we manifest Christ through our mutual affection and love for each other in community. When I ask people why they have joined the parish, they frequently say it is because of the warmth and hospitality here. They experience the same invitation as the disciples did of old when Jesus invited them: "Come and see."

This then is at the heart of our mission of evangelization, of sharing the good news of Jesus. To achieve this lofty goal, we need the generous support of each other. I am always grateful for your kind support to the parish when you respond to the blessings God has given you by returning those blessings to further this mission of making Christ known to the world. Once again we will be conducting an offertory program to consider our weekly giving, of returning God's gifts. This program challenges us to be generous according to our means. Sometimes this could actually mean cutting back on what we give because our financial situation has taken a severe turn for the worse. Sometimes it means offering more. Still other times we realize that we are giving at the right amount. On the weekend of January 16th -17th I will offer a reflection on stewardship of resources and then the following weekend we will have a brief opportunity to fill out a commitment card. Earlier in that week we will mail out a brochure detailing our financial situation to the parish.

This will also provide an opportunity for people who use electronic giving to update your information. The current sheet we use has become outdated now that the Diocese is no longer doing it's Appeal in the same way. Thus, we have reconfigured the sheet to reflect the new approach of the Diocese. We also have dropped some collections and added in the other collections that are in the envelope pack. So for people that use electronic giving (Vanco), we will include in addition to the brochure, a new Vanco sheet as well as your current one so that you have something to base your figures on.

The Diocese has recently moved up its annual appeal to this time (last year we did it in late April/early May). However, because we had our program already scheduled and with the need to update forms we will delay our participation in the Diocesan Appeal by a few weeks. You will still get a mailing from the Diocese but we will not do our formal pulpit appeal for the Diocese until later in the winter. Thank you for your cooperation in this matter.

## Liturgical Ministry - The Handbook

Situation #1: It's Saturday night and Josh suddenly remembers that he is supposed to serve Mass the next morning, the first time in quite a while. He panics and pleads, "Mom, I can't do it! I don't remember how. Don't make me do it, please!" Oh, my. What is a Mom or Dad to do? Josh said he would serve Mass, it's his responsibility, but you don't want it to be a mortifying experience for him - or for you, either.

Situation #2: Jennie, a new parishioner, volunteered to be a lector. She went through the required training but then missed her first lector assignment because she had to be out of town for work. Now at last she will have her debut as a lector at the 9:00 AM Mass, and she is nervous! She can't remember if she is supposed to walk up the ramp or up the sanctuary steps at the beginning of Mass. And she wants to practice her reading until she feels really comfortable with it. Where can she find the reading, anyway?

The help both Josh and Jennie need is now available at their fingertips. The first step is to go the computer and type in [www.bbsacrament.org](http://www.bbsacrament.org). There they will find the new handbook for liturgical ministries, with policies, procedures and practices for servers, lectors, ushers, gift bearers, etc. The handbook was developed by the Liturgical Ministries' Committee of the Spiritual Life Commission to fill a clear need for such a handy resource.

Once Jennie or Josh has pulled up the Blessed Sacrament home page, the next step is to select **Liturgical Ministry Policies**. If Jennie wants to print out the Guidelines for Lectors section, she should click on **PDF file** and once the document is on the screen, click on the print function to select the pages she wants to print. In a few minutes she should have what she needs to put her mind to rest and enable her to prepare well to read the scriptures at Mass the next day, including information about where to find the Sunday readings on-line.

We hope that parishioners will make full use of the liturgical ministries' handbook. Even if you are not new to a specific liturgical ministry, we urge you to read through the guidance for your ministry. At the very least it will be a review for you, but you may also find that the preferred procedure is somewhat different from what you have been doing. The liturgical ministries' handbook was developed so that our weekend liturgies might be as beautiful and prayerful and worshipful as we can make them, for the glory of God.

The handbook is now available on the parish website, but we will continue working with it to make it as useful and reliable as possible.
