MISSION STATEMENT

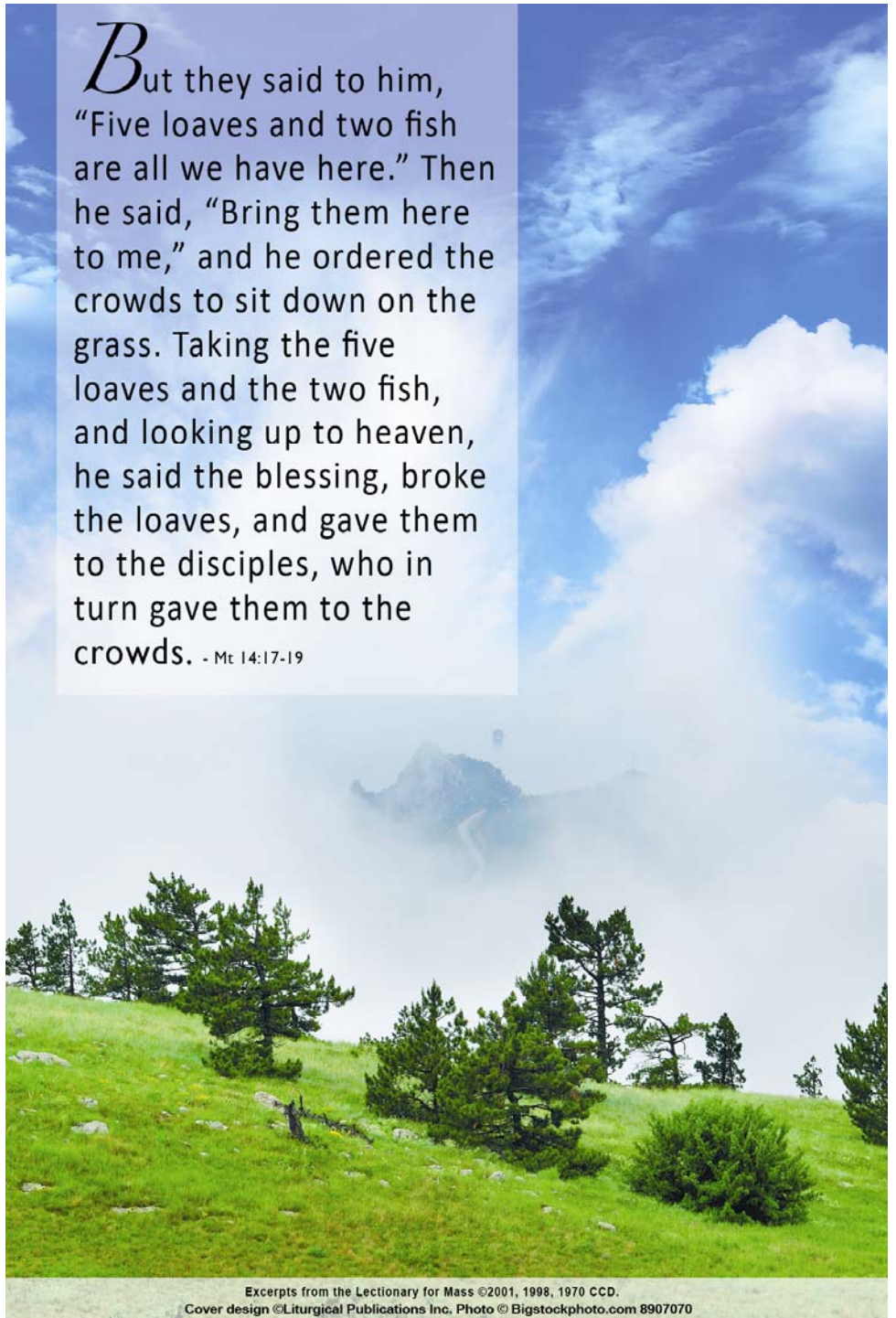

Pastor's Letter

Our celebration of the feast of St. Dominic will be next Sunday night, August 7th at 7:00 PM in the Church. Dr. Patrick Gorman, the director of the Diocesan office of Worship, will be with us to speak to us about the new translation of the Roman Missal that parishes will begin using at the beginning of Advent of this year. However, the Bishop has asked that at Masses beginning in September, that we start to use some of the new Mass settings (set to music). By Advent we will then have some familiarity with the music (the concern is that come Christmas when we have a lot of "visitors" to the parish who also "visit" on Easter, it would be good that the regular parishioners have some familiarity with the music so we can sing with fervor). As a result of this—our catechesis about the overall issue will be moved forward a bit. This is an opportunity then for us to find out about the "whys," the "hows," and the "whens" of this issue. We are grateful that Dr. Gorman can be with us on Sunday. He is a great speaker and comes at the issue with a great pastoral and theological background. Our celebration will begin with evening prayer at 7:00 PM followed by the presentation, some time for questions and answers and finally a reception. Please join us as we begin our exploration in our liturgical lives as Catholics. If St. Dominic was dedicated to a life of evangelization—then this will be an opportunity to engage in evangelization about the Eucharist.

A few summers ago, a young woman by the name of Brenna Wanous volunteered to oversee our vision of gardening and upkeep of the grounds. Working with several parishioners she helped to transform our campus and create a wonderful vision and schedule of activities to maintain the beauty of the campus. Brenna will be having her wedding here next summer. This brings to mind how beautiful the campus looks right now. As we say good-bye to Fr. Ron this weekend, next week we will welcome Fr. Steve Kuhlmann to the parish. Look for Fr. Steve's introduction in next week's bulletin. Let us keep both Fr. Ron and Fr. Steve in our prayers as they make important transitions in their lives.

St. Dominic Talk

On Sunday night, August 7th, at 7:00 PM in the Church, we will celebrate the feast day of St. Dominic (the founder of the Dominican Order which staffs Blessed Sacrament). We will begin with evening prayer followed by a presentation and a reception. Dr. Patrick Gorman, the director of worship for the Diocese, will talk about the new translation of the Roman Missal and how it will affect our lives of worship when we start using this new translation of the Mass in Advent of this year. Bishop Morlino has asked that we already start using some of the new musical settings by the end of September. Several weeks ago there was a bulletin insert from Fr. Pat describing the new Missal and copies of that letter are available in the pamphlet racks in the back of Church in case you missed it (they'll also be available at the talk). Parishioners are encouraged to attend this talk by Dr. Gorman as well as the other opportunities for education that will occur during the course of the next few months.
