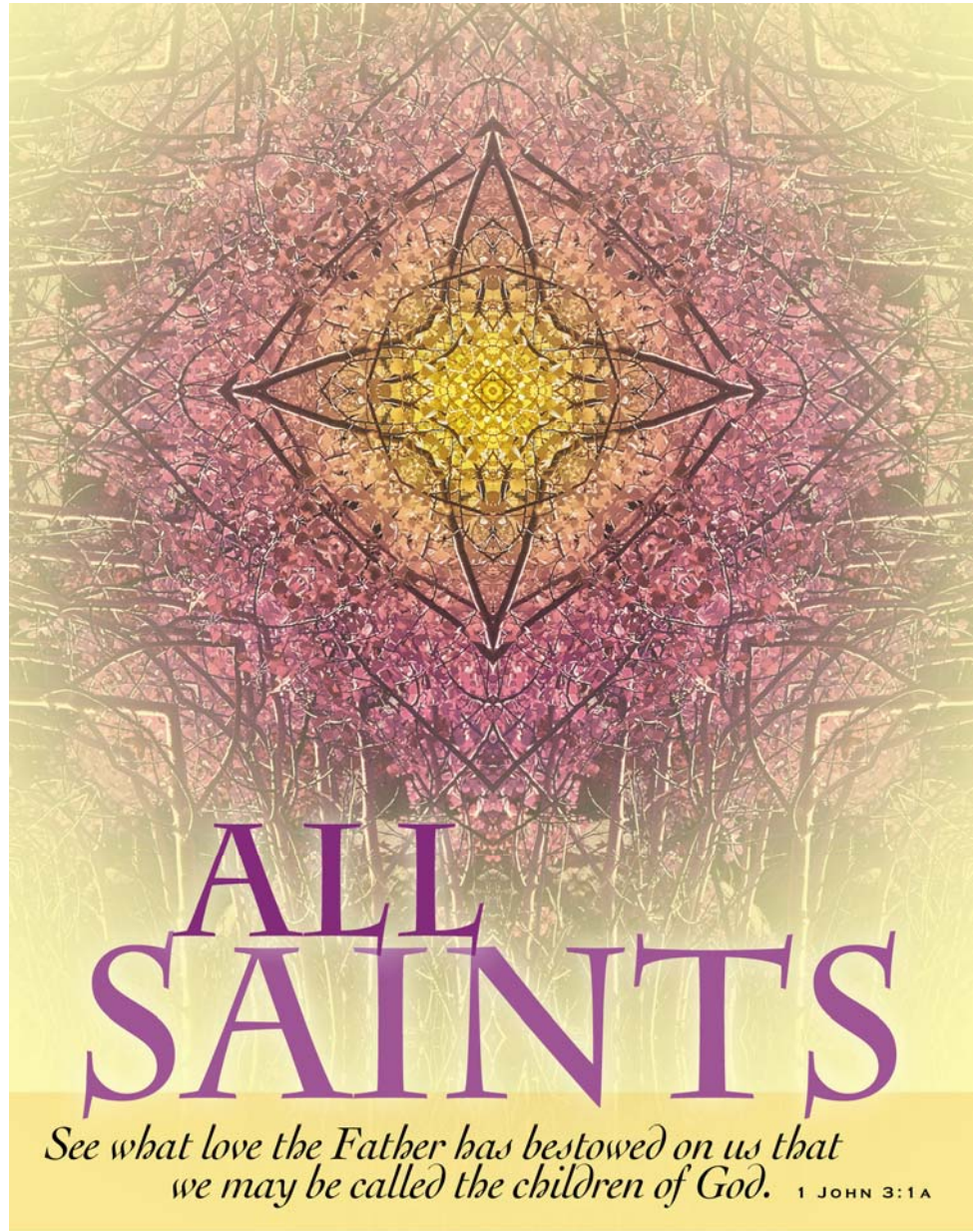
MISSION STATEMENT

Pastor's Letter

Next Sunday afternoon (November 8th), we will have a formal blessing of the new Assembly Hall (Church Basement). Obviously we have already started to use the Hall to a certain degree. Last Sunday we had a packed room in the "band room/bride room/adult faith formation room" for my first talk on health care reform. However, we thought it would be nice to have a formal inauguration. The blessing ceremony will be followed by some entertainment—bringing back people who have performed in our variety shows over the years. After that, we will have some light refreshments in the Friary and people will have an opportunity to tour the Hall. The celebration will begin at 4:00 PM. The blessing and show will conclude by 5:00 PM and the refreshments will be from 5:00-6:00 PM. In the months ahead, we will continue to work on some of the finer finishes. One of the decisions that was made when first designing the area was to allow for some flexibility depending on needs. We anticipate that because of the renovation, people may be more likely to use the space more! As new uses come into play, we may need to make adjustments but we put in as much infrastructure as possible to accommodate such added uses. So as we use the Hall, we may note that we may need more theatrical lighting. Or we may note a need to configure storage in a different way. I would see the space as a work in process for a while as we configure the place to best suit our needs. Here it would be important that if you use the space and note something that might need adjustment, please let me know. I can't guarantee that a suggestion will be implemented. At the same time, we want to make the space as user-friendly and multi-purpose as possible.

We celebrate All Saints Day this weekend. On Monday we celebrate All Souls Day. I very much encourage people to participate in our evening liturgy at 7:00 PM in which we will pray for our beloved dead, especially for those who have died recently. I will be presiding and preaching. Everyone is invited. We will have a candle lighting ceremony similar to last year at the 11:00 AM Mass (in case your memory is that good!).

"Few of us tend to think that we pray well, and the reason may be that we have too many misconceptions about what constitutes good prayer. For instance, we tend to think of prayer as something that originates with us and is always conscious to us, rather than as something motivated by God; we think that prayer has to have a lofty content or that the words need to come from a book. We assume that our prayer time needs to be focused, and that we've failed at praying if our mind wanders. And yet, if we allow the Holy Spirit within us to pray as the Spirit wills, we may find that our prayer occurs also when we let go of these self-imposed constraints and allow the experiences of our life—as we reflect on them in honesty—to become the content of our prayer." These are words from the beginning of Br. Joseph Schmidt's book Praying Our Experiences. Many of us struggle with personal prayer and this book based on Scripture, the thoughts of many saints and sound psychological insight challenges us to a deeper and more fruitful understanding of prayer. This book will be our text for our Advent Book club. Advent is a wonderful time to pray and reflect as Mary did—reflecting on the mystery of the incarnation in her heart. You can purchase the book this weekend and next for \$8.00 at the back of Church. The discussion of the book will be on Sunday night, December 13th at 7 PM in the Church Basement.

Also tickets this week and next will be on sale for our Fall dinner. This is always a wonderful night of good food and drink as well as spiritual reflection. Once again Phil Hurley from Sardine's will be providing his usual gourmet style meal. After dinner, parishioners will be reflecting on the notion of transitions in their lives and how prayer and their faith were part of those transitions whether the transitions were happy (the birth of a child) or heart-breaking (the death of a child, dealing with a serious illness). See the bulletin for further details.

Finally, I was perusing the November issue of Madison Magazine and noted that several of our parishioners were recognized as Person of the Year or for having a "very good year." Congratulations go out to parishioner Steve Stricker as Person of the Year for his fine golfing accomplishments and community involvement. Very good year recipients included Wendy Vardaman for her promotion of poetry as a co-editor of *Verse Wisconsin*. Andy Russell was recognized for his leadership at the Catholic Multi-cultural Center and his work in keeping the Center open last spring. Golfer Jerry Kelly was recognized for his willingness to try to keep a PGA event here in Wisconsin in order to promote local business in the state. And Vince Sweeney who along with his family has ties to Blessed Sacrament was recognized for his work in university relations for UW. I'm always very proud to see how so many parishioners are not only involved in the life of the parish but in so many other causes. You all are terrific.

Religious Education - Elementary Level



There are Religious Education Classes for Kindergarten- Grade 6 on Sundays, (November 1st, 8th and 22nd) in the school and Parish Center.

What is a priest?

In this Year for Priests, it is good to review what we mean when we say 'priest.' A priest is an authorized mediator who offers a true sacrifice acknowledging God's supreme dominion over us and in expiation for our sins.

Christ, who is God and man, is the first, last, and greatest priest of the New Law. He is the eternal high priest who offered himself once and for all on the Cross, the priceless victim, who renews that sacrifice on the altar through the ministry of the Church.

Within the Church are men specially ordained as priests to consecrate and offer the body and blood of Christ in the Mass. The Apostles became the first ordained priests when on Holy Thursday night Christ told them to do in his memory what he had just done for them at the Last Supper. All priests and bishops trace their ordination directly to the Apostles. Their second essential priestly power, to forgive sins, was conferred on them by the Risen Christ when he appeared to the Apostles on Easter Sunday and said, "Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained" (John 20:23).

All the Christian faithful, however, also share in the priesthood through baptism. We are enabled to offer ourselves in sacrifice with Christ through the Eucharistic liturgy. We offer the Mass in the sense that we internally unite ourselves with the outward offering made by the ordained priest alone.

Parish News and Events

St. Albert the Great talk - Recently in the *Wisconsin State Journal*, a front page story delved into the question as to whether prayer for people who are sick actually works in terms of healing. Ironically, the article appeared on the same day that five people were canonized in Rome. Of course, to be canonized as a saint in the Catholic Church, two miracles have to be directly attributable to prayer directed at the saint for his/her intercession before God. Is there any scientific proof that prayer either works or doesn't work in terms of healing disease? Does it matter if there is not scientific proof? Can there even be scientific proof one way or another? These will be some of the questions addressed at our annual St. Albert the Great talk in honor of the great Dominican natural scientist and theologian from the 13th century. Fr. Pat will offer a presentation entitled: "Prayer and Healing: For Those who Believe, is Any Proof Necessary?" The talk will be on Monday night, November 16th in the Church beginning with prayer at 7:00 PM followed by the talk and a reception. Invite a friend to come with you.

Fr. Pat's series on health care reform continues this weekend with a talk entitled: "A Catholic Approach to Health Care Reform." Next week, Fr. Pat will finish the series with a presentation entitled: "Politics and the Art of the Possible: What are the Non-negotiables for us as Catholics in Terms of Reform?" This last session will deal with the reality that as Catholics, we have an ideal vision of what should be included in health care reform and what shouldn't be. However, what are the non-negotiable issues for which we must draw a line in the sand despite the complexity of the issue? What are the issues that we can be satisfied with an incremental approach? What are the issues that as Catholics, we offer more prudential advice as opposed to concrete principles that we allow for negotiation and/or experimentation? The talks are on Sunday in the band room/bride room/adult faith formation room in the Church Basement from 10:10-10:50 AM (unless we run out of space as we nearly did this past week in which case we'll be in the main body of the basement). Copies of the handouts for the previous week are in the pamphlet racks at the back of Church. You need not have attended a previous session to attend a new session.

We will be selling the text for our Advent Book Club this weekend and next (as well as the parish center during the week) at the back of Church after Mass. This Advent's selection is Praying Our Experiences by Br. Joseph Schmidt, FSC. See the pastor's letter for a broader description of the book. In brief, if you are looking for a way to improve the way you pray during the season of Advent and beyond, this is a book for you. The cost of the book is \$8.00. Our discussion of the book will be on Sunday night, December 13th at 7:00 PM in the Church Basement. Discussion questions will be included at a later date.

Fall Dinner, November 20th - We will have our annual Fall Dinner in the Friary beginning with hors d'oeuvres at 6 PM. This year we will have a panel of parishioners sharing how their faith has helped them through life's transitions. There will be table discussions after the presentation. The dinner will be catered again by Phil Hurley from Sardine's/Marigold Kitchen. Please sign up at the back of church this weekend and next weekend.

All Souls Day Masses - The Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed will take place at a special evening Mass at 7:00 PM on Monday, November 2. Please consider being present and praying with the parish community that evening, or at the regular 8:30 AM Eucharist. You will be invited to remember loved ones who have died at each Mass, by coming early and signing their names into the intention book under the choir loft. Parish members who have died in the last three years, and whose funerals were celebrated here, will be remembered in a special way. At that Eucharist, we will remember our beloved recently deceased members in a "calling of names" ceremony, and support their families by our shared prayers.

Church Basement Dedication & Reopening - As the Blessed Sacrament Community it is time to come together in celebration as we dedicate and reopen the church basement.
