MISSION STATEMENT

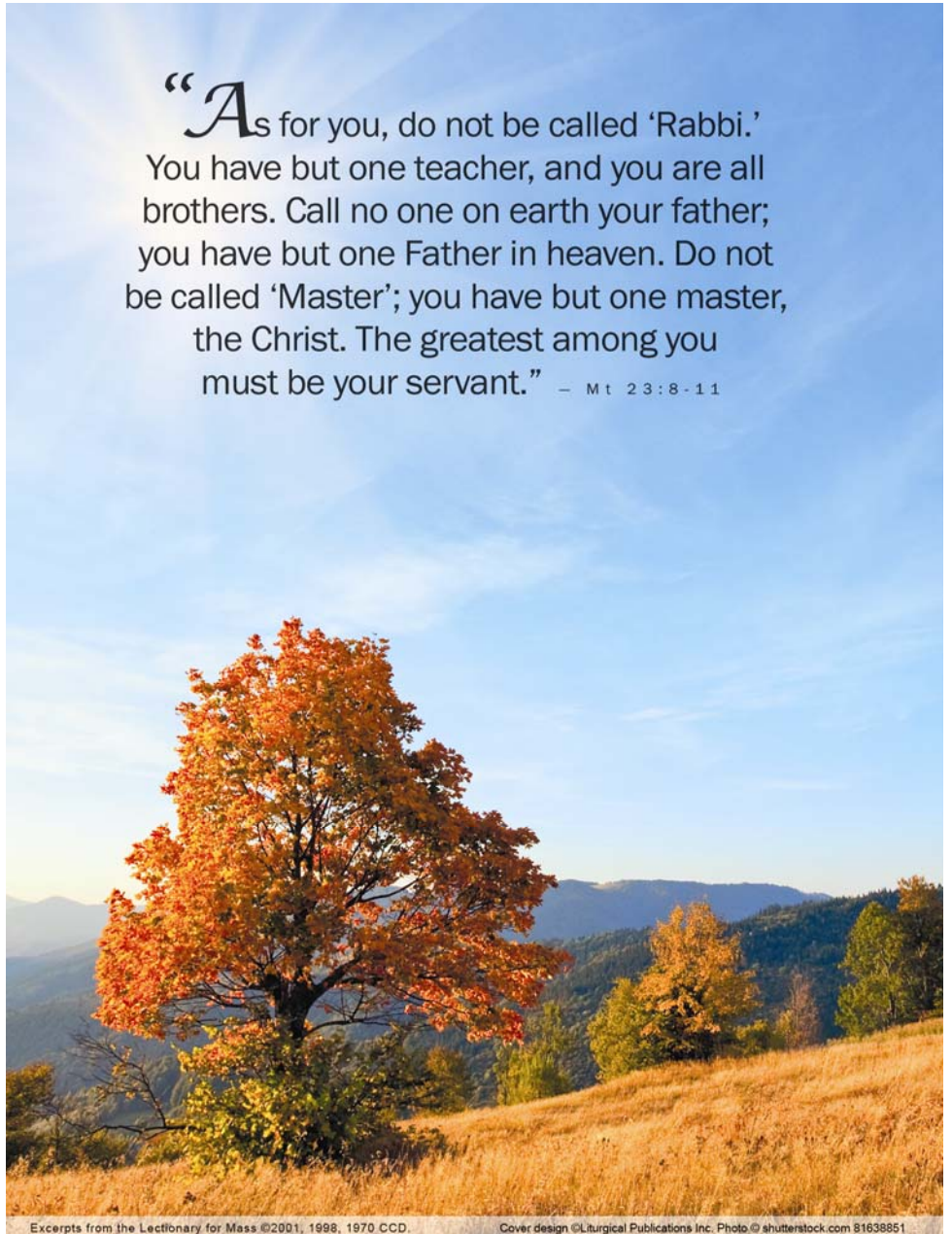

Pastor's Letter

We're approaching Halloween and the days are getting shorter and the nights colder. Winter is on the horizon. Winter is not my favorite time in Wisconsin (not a lot of golfing opportunities). I start to crave carbs. In some ways, I truly think I have a mild case of seasonal affective disorder when I am in the northern climates. Of course, I am not a doctor—I just slept in a Holiday Inn Express so I could make this diagnosis. However, there is a difference between self-diagnosis and follow-up treatment.

This is true in the spiritual life as well. As we approach the feasts of All Saints (a holy day of obligation on Tuesday) and All Souls (not a holy day but nevertheless a good day to do a great work of mercy by praying for the dead at Mass), we are reminded that we are rarely effective in terms of totally treating our spiritual maladies. This is why God in his boundless mercy gave us the gift of Purgatory in which we are purified of those moral failures that we were unable to eradicate during our life-time of spiritual follow-ups. We know our sins, we self-diagnose well, and yet we do not seem to be able to overcome them totally. Our words echo those of St. Paul in Romans 7: "For we know that the law is spiritual, but I am of the flesh, sold into slavery under sin. I do not understand my own actions. For I do not do what I want, but I do the very thing I hate. . . . Now, if I do what I do not want, it is no longer I that do it, but sin that dwells within me." This is why I eat the unhealthy comfort food carbs as I prepare to hibernate for the winter. This is why I gossip when I know I should be building up rather than tearing down. The authentic "I" that is directed towards God and desires to do the right thing becomes side-tracked by the sin and weakness that dwells within me. Few of us seem able to master this urge to sin because it is so powerful. We should in no way underestimate the effects of original sin or the power of the evil one to tempt us. But like St. Paul, we should not grow despondent when we fail to master these spiritual faults and give in to the bad "spiritual carbs." As St. Paul reminds us in Romans 7: 24-25: "Wretched man that I am! Who will rescue me from this body of death? Thanks be to God through Jesus Christ our Lord!" This trust in Christ and his mercy does not provide license to sin nor should it dull our desire to continue to diagnosis and treat our spiritual ills by presuming upon God's mercy. Rather it provides us with a consolation when desiring to do the right thing, we still fall victim to our baser desires. So this Tuesday as we give thanks to God for the saints and look to our own high-calling, let us also think ahead to All Souls and thank God for his gift of mercy in Purgatory.

The activities keep rolling along at Blessed Sacrament these days. I hope many of you are planning to attend our parish Christmas Market (formerly the Christmas Bazaar) in a couple of weeks. It is always a great way to do a little Christmas shopping and to see old friends and meet new ones in the many activities of the days. Our study of the Mass and Scripture goes on hiatus that week because of the Christmas Market and Sunday Funday for the kids.

Also, if October is seen as Respect Life month, November is understood as the month associated with the dead (not just because of All Saints and All Souls). The liturgical calendar is full of special feast days for the saints. One of the realities that this brings to mind is that of the dying process, so on the feast of St. Albert the Great (the great scientist and theologian), we will have a talk on issues surrounding the use of life support. When should we continue to treat? When can we let go and allow our loved one to go home to the Lord?

As you know Advent is fast approaching with the new translation of the Roman Missal. It also means it is time to think about our Advent Book Club. See this week's bulletin about details about our selection and when you can purchase the book.

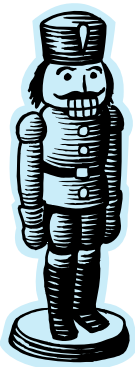
