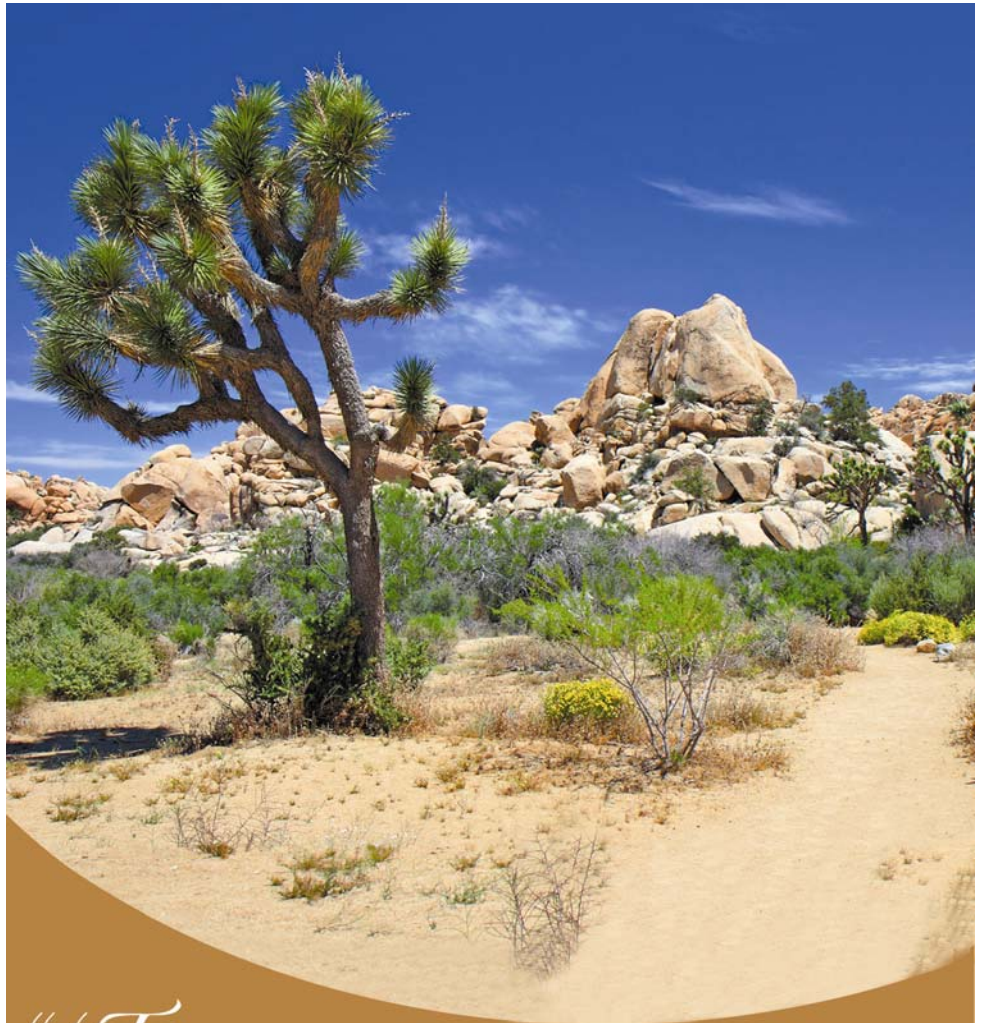
MISSION STATEMENT

Pastor's Letter

Thanks to all who came out for our parish golf outing and also who helped to sponsor it. We had lower numbers than usual because apparently people were focused on the Nebraska/Wisconsin game and all of the pre-game parties that started early in the morning. I did watch the game on TV and Wisconsin looks pretty tough. I suspect they will be unbeaten when they play my favorite team—Penn State—on Thanksgiving weekend here in Madison. I'm hoping to do the Mass for the Penn State team again! So if the Lions happen to lose, I may be in hiding on that first Sunday of Advent. Then if there is any grumbling about the new translation of the Mass—Fr. Steve can deal with it! Actually, we introduced the new translation of the Gloria this past weekend and people seemed to pick up the new text and music rather easily. For copies of all of the changes to the congregation's parts—there are copies in the pamphlet racks (golden rod sheets—part 1 and salmon sheets—part 2). Thanks again for your continued cooperation as we work to enhance our life of worship. This week, I have included as an insert some information on the new translation of the Nicene creed which is where we will notice the most difference and that will probably take us the most time to adapt to. Why is that? It is because some changes are so simple—they will become rote rather quickly—"and also with you" becomes "and with your spirit." The sung parts of the Mass will become easier to recall because they will be reinforced in our memories by the tie of words to music. However, we will not be singing the creed—so I invite you to look at the rationale for the changes in the creed and the theological nuance that is being communicated. For instance, the new text talks about God being the maker of things "visible and invisible." The old version spoke of things "seen and unseen." Besides being more in accord with the Latin, the new translation makes more sense. For one can be unseen and yet still be visible. The word invisible though points to the supernatural (e.g., angels) or such things as the moral law which was made by God. So the new text provides a much richer translation than the paraphrase of the old translation.

This weekend, we begin a series on the Mass and scripture (that will tangentially touch on the new translation). However, the main purpose of this series is to remind us that as a Catholic people, we are a Church of word and sacrament and those two realities are intimately tied together. That is, these two beautiful ways that the Lord mediates his grace to us cannot be separated. So if anyone ever raises the issue that the Church and the Eucharist are not tied to the Bible, this is your chance to be able to explain the depths of the Church's focus on Scripture. As the great Church theologian, St. Jerome said—ignorance of the scripture is ignorance of Christ.

Next weekend, we celebrate Catholic Charities Sunday. I want to thank Brian Cain (the director of Catholic Charities) and his staff for the great work they do in the Diocese. The staff and volunteers truly show their respect for life by their promotion of life through their many programs that help those in need. Certainly at times we see the Catholic Church in an unpleasant light in the news media, etc. We see the good things less frequently in the media. But if you ever are tempted to become cynical about organized religion—look to the good work of Catholic Charities. Please know that your contributions to the Diocesan Annual Catholic Appeal fund a bulk of the work of Catholic Charities. Speaking of the Annual Appeal, we have reached our goal for the ACA (well actually we are at 99%). Thanks for your generosity that funds the important outreach ministries of the Diocese. I am very proud of the generosity of the parish. We are the 5th largest contributing parish in the Diocese and your efforts make a big difference in so many people's lives.

Fr. Steve will be away the bulk of this week and next seeing his parents out on the East Coast. Fr. Matt Walsh will be helping me out a bit during his absence. I am always grateful for Fr. Matt's assistance with Mass and confessions. It is great to have him as part of our Dominican community along with Br. Vince and Br. Terrence. Speaking of Dominicans, we will be having a "Come and See" weekend down in our studium in St. Louis the weekend of the October 21-23 for people interested in joining the Order. There are flyers on the bulletin boards in the back of Church as well as details in this bulletin for people who think they might have a vocation to religious life and/or priesthood.


