Pastor's Letter

I hope everyone has been enjoying the lovely weather these days. Br. Vince reminded me that the Farmer's Almanac is predicting a drier but frigid winter for us. Some more scientific studies predict a warmer but wetter winter. So far, nobody is predicting a dry, warm winter! Pity. However, life is not perfect. We generally do not experience heaven on earth. In fact, the only time we do that is in the Eucharist when we already participate in the heavenly banquet and experience a foretaste of eternal life. Of course, we do not share in this heavenly meal in its fullest form. Nevertheless, our most heavenly experience on earth is the Mass. Now I am sure there are some who might say: "Well if that's what heaven is like, then I'm not going." Coincidentally, we have a sign in our copy room that says: "If there is no chocolate in heaven, I'm not going."

Although uttered most frequently by young people, even adults periodically will think—Mass is boring. I can sympathize with this. Growing up, one of my pastors was not a good preacher despite being a very holy man. When his homily started my Dad's eyes glazed over and he started doing Math problems. I would pull out the bulletin and start reading unless I was fending off my younger brother kicking me or elbowing me (my Mom usually tried to sit between us to prevent such shenanigans). Most of us judge Mass using a subjective measure of a non-faith based perception of experience. We understand excitement/boredom from a human rather than divine standpoint. To the untrained spiritual eye, there is not a lot of excitement at Mass. Yet, if one looks at the lives of the saints, often times they experienced a sense of ecstasy during the Eucharist. What did they know or experience that we don't? Why did they experience Mass as anything but boring?

One reason is that we may have never been properly catechized on an intellectual level as to the mystery we celebrate at Mass. We enter into the mystery of the paschal mystery—the passion, death and resurrection of Jesus. We are joined with the angels and saints in the heavenly Kingdom for a moment. We receive the Body and Blood of Jesus—that gift that brings us eternal life. In other words, we share in the divinity of Christ who first humbled himself to share in our humanity. We are inspired by the Word of God. When we complain that God never speaks directly to us, we forget that God speaks to us through the Bible. Yes, the Word of God is mediated through the human authors of the Bible books. Nevertheless, God authentically communicates with us on Sunday. We enter into the mystery of the mystical Body of Christ where we recognize a profound connection with our fellow

Christians through the sacrament of baptism. This calls us to put away all discord and to be reconciled with one another before coming to the altar of the Lord. This experience then moves us to pray on behalf of each other, we ask forgiveness for the times we have harmed each other, we give thanks to God for the blessings he has given us, we praise God, the Almighty One, who so loved the world that he sent the Son to suffer and die for us. On a spiritual level, how could we call this boring?

But this is on the level of the mind and not on the level of emotion. The problem here is that we have not developed a taste for spiritual excitement. What do I mean by that? Think of children at a wedding reception. Often there is a wonderful meal. But what do the children want? They want macaroni and cheese along with chicken fingers with ketchup. Preferably, the macaroni and cheese is that deep orange color from Kraft mac and cheese. The wonderful meal that the adults have would be unappealing to the children. Children often do not have a palate for good food. We are spiritual children when it comes to the Mass. We have not developed our spiritual palate so that we can taste and see the goodness of the Lord on an experiential level. This is what separates us from the saints in terms of our experience and appreciation of the Eucharist.

What must we do to develop this refined spiritual palate? First, we need to let go of the expectation of experiencing spiritual ecstasy during Mass every week. It is an unrealistic expectation. Spouses would never stay together if they had the expectation of exhilaration every day. Second, we must realize that our felt experience is not always an accurate barometer of what we are objectively experiencing. Often, we may not feel close to God, yet God is closer to us each and every second of the day than we can ever imagine. Third, we must make the Eucharist a central part of our Christian lives. Not going to Mass will not make us more appreciative of the mystery present during the celebration. Such a practice will not refine our spiritual palate. Fourth, we must work to understand the Mass better. Sometimes the intellect leads our emotions. Fifth, on a practical level, becoming more involved in the Mass can help us focus (e.g., consider being a cantor, lector, server, etc.). Finally, by cultivating a life of love outside of Mass, we will become more attuned to the gift of love who is God. When we become more aware of God in this way, we will be more likely to encounter him in Mass—knowing our hearts are restless until they rest in God.
